

## All Saints' Day—November 1 A HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION Masses: 8:30 am and 6 pm

All Saints' Day is a solemn Holy Day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven. It should not be confused with All Souls' Day, which is observed on November 2, and is dedicated to those who have died and not yet reached heaven.

All Saints' Day includes the known, canonized saints and the vast numbers of domestic or anonymous saints, truly holy men and women who have died in the state of grace.

### Saints and Holy Ones Who Have Touched New Orleans

Venerable Henriette Delille (1813-1862) born in New Orleans; worked with slaves and free people of color in New Orleans; founded the Sisters of the Holy Family



Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos, C.Ss.R. (1819-1867) born in Fussen, Bavaria, Germany; worked tirelessly with poor, sick and needy; died of yellow fever in an epidemic in New Orleans

Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, M.S.C. (1850-1917) born in Sant'Angelo Lodigiano, Italy; worked with immigrants and orphans; first U.S. citizen to be canonized; established orphanage (later became high school) in New Orleans; founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus





Saint Katharine Drexel (1858-1955) born in Philadelphia, PA; worked with Native Americans and African Americans in western and southwestern U.S.; founded Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament; established Xavier University of Louisiana and many other schools throughout the country.

Saint Pope John Paul II (1920-2005) born in Wadowice, Poland; helped end Communism in Poland; improved Church relations with Judaism, Islam and some non-Catholic Christian religions; visited New Orleans in 1987 and has had a lasting, positive effect on the city and on the entire world.

### All Souls' Day November 2

All Souls' Day is a Christian festival that honors the souls of those who have died. Observing Christians usually remember their deceased relatives on this day.

Believers remember and pray for the souls

of people who are in Purgatory - the place in which the dead atone for their sins before being granted the vision of God in Heaven. The need for this is that when a soul leaves the body, it is not entirely cleansed of minor sins. Through the prayers of the faithful on Earth, the dead are cleansed of their sins so they may enter into heaven.

Envelopes for including your deceased loved ones in the parish Purgatorial List can be found in your latest set of contribution envelopes. If you do not receive envelopes, some of these enrollment envelopes can be found at the church doors. The names of the deceased will be listed in Mass intentions throughout the year. One Mass each week is offered for the repose of the souls on the Purgatorial List (Poor Souls in Purgatory.)
