Installation Installation Installation

Installation is a rite in which a pastor is publicly placed into his role as pastor in a specific church community such as a parish. While ordination happens only once in a priest's ministry, installation happens each time he begins serving in a new congregation or new role as pastor. The installation rite happens within a Sunday Mass in the church where one is to serve. In the Archdiocese of New Orleans, the dean

of the area churches administers the rite of installation for the new pastor. Then normally the newly installed pastor will officially take over the leadership of the given church.

In light of this, Rev. Michael M. Labre, who is newly appointed as pastor of St. James Major Catholic Church, will be installed September 30, 2018, by Very Rev. John Restrepo, O.P., Dean of the City Park Deanery of the Archdiocese of New Orleans. You are invited to pray for Father Labre and to celebrate this day with him as he assumes his role as pastor. Sanctuary candles must be at least 51% bees-wax, therefore we ask a donation to the church of \$7.00 (actual cost) for each candle burned.
